Irene Victoria Cyr was born on February 6th, 1930 in Plains, Montana. Her parents were Frank and Flossie Helterline. She grew up on a farm and her stories about being chased by a bull and bucked off by a horse are true! As a child she loved to lay in the pasture and watch the clouds. She also collected rocks and still talks about the Rocky Mountains that she lived by.

When Irene was in high school she was rather shy, but was talked into becoming a cheerleader. It was in high school where she met the love of her life, Theodore Cyr. Irene's bedroom was upstairs and at night Ted would sit outside the window and play his guitar and sing to her! Ted joined the Navy and was stationed in San Diego. One year later, Irene jumped on a bus and headed to



San Diego to marry Ted before he was sent overseas. On October 3rd, 1950 they went to Arizona with their best friends, Harold and Donna Shafer, for a quick wedding and were later married in the Catholic Church.



Irene lived by Mount Baldy, which was a volcano, and she was fascinated by it. In the 1970's Ted owned an airplane and they flew to Montana several times. He even flew Irene over the volcano so she could see inside it, and boy did it make her happy!

Ted and Irene have three children; Larry, Yvonne, and Gary. Larry passed away on August 17, 1994. Irene has six grandchildren and nine great-

grandchildren. Ted and Irene were married for 58 years when Ted passed away on December 8th, 2008.

Irene was a stay at home mom and was devoted to her husband and children. Irene loved to work in the yard. She had a third of an acre and it was beautiful! She also loved to bake. At Christmas time she would bake hundreds of cookies, many different varieties, and give them out to everyone! Some of her recipes are still family favorites such as her gingerbread boys and frosted sugar cookies. Irene was a devout Catholic, and her children went to Saint Mary's School.

Irene is really funny and she has so many funny sayings that we'll always remember like, "as the crow flies", "only the shadow knows", "let there by light", "there's more than one way to skin a cat", "age before beauty", "better safe than sorry", etc. She is the most kindhearted woman.
